It does present a challenge playing on unfamiliar rink markings but thankfully results for our players have, in the main, been positive.

Like it, or not, we do have a dress code, which is printed in the Rules section of the Handbook, and I'm sorry to say the standard is slipping. If you're not sure, please, read through this section. Items I mainly pick up on are incorrect dress for club comps by both players and markers, outerwear that is not white or Zapkam blue/green and caps that are not an approved colour. Please help me by following the rules. And yes, I know, and accept, that there are occasions when situations arise and you don't have the appropriate item to hand e.g., you step in to mark a comp because the booked marker hasn't turned up. That's fine. (Soapbox put away again).

Rink Diary has been operating all season and hopefully most will have now mastered at least the bits they need to master. If you still have concerns about using Rink Diary, please, don't fall by the wayside. Those with Admin access will get you signed up for games or you can ask a friend to assist. Please, don't think you'll be thought of as silly if you ask an 'obvious' question. If you don't know something you'd be silly **not** to ask and many times the answer is straightforward. I admit that I had concerns about using Rink Diary exclusively from day 1 but my fears have been shown to be ill founded and it is so much easier to use the system wherever you are. If you don't have access at home there are access terminals in the Office and the Clubhouse ready to use. Thanks Steven, you did a great job getting this to where we are and thanks also to those that have assisted.

As I indicated above, a number of members and teams are progressing well in their National and County Competitions so to them and all those competing, whether externally or internally, I wish you good luck in the remaining rounds of your competition.

A roller shutter is to be installed for the kitchen opening and a PA system has been bought so that we won't be able to sleep through all those important announcements any more.

There remains a substantial sum of ringfenced donations, which is earmarked for greenside seating. Initial deposits have been collected for next year's Tour and the deposit for the hotel in Torquay has been paid.

Additionally, I remind you that we have sufficient monies in our reserves to cover the major projects that are referred to in the Facilities Manager's article.

An enjoyable and well attended President's Day raised £450. When added to several successful social events over the winter, this now takes the total for his Charity BUST to nearly £850. Well done Tom.

Maintenance & Facilities Update

The 2023 season started with a bit of a mad dash to ensure the facility was ready. Perhaps the teams had spent too much time in the winter on bigger projects like the work on the new storage container, decorating both changing rooms and the toilets, various plumbing activities, winter care of the green and our bi-weekly task of cleaning and rubbish removal. However, with the aid of a good number of members we had a great morning spring clean and preparation for the start of the season.

We did have one minor mishap when trying to erect the two gazebos where we had significant rips in both covers. After they had been repaired, we were advised that we should have been regularly soaking the canvas throughout the hot dry summer of 22 to maintain the cloth. We are now performing the drenching every couple of weeks and maybe looking to purchase new covers for the 2024 season.

We must be particularly grateful to the green team who picked up the management and maintenance of the green whilst our greenkeeper John was indisposed. Fortunately, we are extremely pleased to see John on the mend and already spending time with his team. We are also grateful for the support given to the regular team by other members in preparing the green for play.

Just before the season started, all the good work during the off-season was threatened by a significant infestation of leatherjackets, the larvae of the crane fly. They can cause devastation to closely managed lawns and we were lucky that a timely dose of chemicals drove the larvae into the ditches where it was all hands to the pump to scoop them up into buckets for disposal. The hot dry spell then caused more issues as the irrigation system was out of commission and we were unable to water the green. We have since installed new pipework to the storage tank and watering is now available as necessary.

Although possibly not at its best yet, the green team with John back in the lead will be working hard to ensure our green is back to being one of the best in the area.

Our list of outstanding maintenance/development tasks continues to grow and in the next few months as well as our regular bins, bar waste and rubbish removal, the team will concentrate on installing a new kitchen counter shutter, progressing the fit-out of the storage container, replacing the stand-pipe facility near the main gate, treatment to the main gate timbers, fence painting, and clearing unwanted furniture and other detritus from the premises.

Meanwhile we have contractors completing the two new honours boards and updating the others with 2022 winner and working on estimates for the green-edge work. Meanwhile we are investigating options for displaying club honours.

Our future plans include covered seating for the green edge.

The maintenance team operates throughout the year on Monday and Friday mornings and work closely with the greenkeeping team to maintain and enhance the Club facilities that make all our activities safe, enjoyable and in keeping with one of the best bowling facilities in the region. Umpire's Corner – Jamie Campbell

The outdoor season is well underway and as I mentioned last year the 'little red book' Crystal Mark 3rd Edition has now been replaced by Laws of the Sport of Bowls, Crystal Mark Fourth Edition.

It wasn't all plain sailing however, as a couple of the 'new' Laws caused such a furore that the World Bowls Laws Committee had to issue a memorandum to rescind these Laws (37.1.3 and 37.1.5.3).

"Despite a clarification document published on the World Bowls Website in September 2022, it has become very clear from communications that the two laws have caused a great deal of confusion and have resulted in games being forfeited incorrectly following players innocently stopping bowls from entering the ditch.

Having considered several options to improve the intent of these two laws, the World Bowls Laws Advisory Group have concluded and recommended to the Board of World Bowls to rescind them."

So, the question you might be asking now is, 'what if someone decides to stop a bowl at any time?'

Well, the answers are; if a team or player deliberately stops a bowl to gain an advantage, then your only recourse now is to apply Law 36; Deliberate non-sporting action, which will require an appeal made to the Controlling Body within 24 hours.

If the bowl is stopped accidently, displaced or prevented from entering the ditch, then refer to the Laws of displacement (37), or just apply common sense, because as we know, stopping bowls entering the ditch is quite a regular occurrence and usually to prevent further incident, especially if the bowl is travelling at speed!

A question from Phil 'Flipper' Tellwright:

Whilst the No3's are deciding who has won an end and by how many, although it is very clear that Red have the shot wood, if not more, the Blue No.1 starts to collect up the bowls with the pusher and collects a couple of woods, one Blue and one Red. The Red No. 3 believes that the Red wood collected might have been in the count. The original position of the Red wood collected is of course unknown. What happens?

Answer:

The Skip of the Red team must have the displaced bowls replaced to their former positions. If the No3 was so sure it was in the count, he (she) should be able to advise the Skip of its former position and then decide the outcome.

Law 37.1.5 Displacement of a bowl at rest.

37.1.5.1 If a bowl at rest or a toucher in the ditch is displaced by a player and it has not disturbed the head after it is displaced, the opponent must put the bowl back to its former position.

37.1.5.2 If a bowl at rest or a toucher in the ditch is displaced by a player and it has disturbed the head after it is displaced, the opponent must put the bowl back to its former position and replace any part of the head disturbed after the displacement.

Coaching Update – Ken Tudor

Bowls England Awards Evening: This being my first opportunity of the season to provide an update on the Coaching side of things, I must first of all thank all those at the Club who were instrumental in the submission of my nomination in the "Coach of The Year" category, at the Bowls England Awards Night. It was a great honour and privilege to make the final four in this prestigious event and whilst I did not win, that accolade fittingly went to fellow Gloucestershire Coach David Rolls, who has helped me in my own development over the years, I was immensely proud to have been lucky enough to have been short listed. However, I would not have had that opportunity without the support of so many individuals, especially the Coaching Team here at Olveston, who we as a Club, are so very lucky to have within our ranks.

Bowls England did a tremendous job in putting the event together, held at the Athena Centre in Leicester, it was rather like the Bowls equivalent of the Oscars and following the success of the Commonwealth Games, it was attended by many of our medal winning stars.

I would also like to make special mention to Derek Severs, Chris Blake, David Wiggell, Ian Gauld, Joe Hardwick and Debbie who took the trouble to travel to Leicester and stay over for the evening to support me, it was really special to have them there to share the experience.



Beginners Course: The Club's Coaching Team delivered a 4 Week Beginners Course at the Club during the first few Saturday mornings at the start of the season. The Course was attended by 19 individuals and many on the Course have gone on to join the Club, several are now regularly playing in Club Nights, Friendlies and some are already competing in competitions and leagues, which is very rewarding for us as coaches to witness.

Wotton- Under- Edge BC Development Day – Coach Dave Lewis was recently approached by one of the Captains at Wotton-Under-Edge regarding providing some sort of Development Sessions for his club members. Dave and I pulled together a set of skills and discussions, around Head Reading, Shot Play, Rink Management, Tactical Scenario's etc which was attended by 16 or so Wotton players. When you get feedback from them as we did below, you know the time was well spent.

"Just to say that the coaching course on Sunday with the two coaches from Olveston was extremely worthwhile. They both know the game inside out and took us through simple graded activities, which lead to improving our techniques with achievable and satisfying goals. They also had some illuminating tips on match play. I think the end result was extremely happy bowlers all of whom had gained confidence and enjoyed the afternoon."

We had 21 adults and children attend, to have a go, with some very capable potential on display. 
